- 3. The <u>Carolina Core</u> provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
- Students in Palmetto College are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 122 course through course credit or the corresponding foreign language placement score.
- 5. Liberal Studies major courses (27 hours) must be at the upper level, with at least 15 hours at the 400-level or above, with the exception of Sociology, in which the following 300-level courses may be substituted for 400-level courses: SOCY 304, 305, 312, 320, 323, 340. At least 15 hours must be USC courses. No more than hours of the major will be accepted in transfer. The student's major will be chosen from **TWO of the following disciplines**, with a minimum of 12 hours required in each of the two disciplines:
