- 1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 3.65 cumulative GPA at the end of their first year (fall, spring, summer term) followed by a 3.500 at the end of the third semester.
- 2. Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
- 3. Students who do not place into MATH 122 or MATH 141 and do not bring in additional advanced credit, may need to enroll in 18 hours each term of freshman year.
- 4. Students in the International Business: Eurasian Business major must complete a minimum of four 300-level or higher Turkish or Russian language courses as part of their required program components. The Language Placement test will determine at which level the student will begin. Foreign language courses can be part of the required directed coursework, which may consist of courses toward a minor, cognate, or other coursework.
- 5. The Carolina Core provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
- 6. International Business: Eurasian Business majors are required to study abroad in the 3rd, 4th, and 7th semesters, as well as in the summers before the 3rd semester and following the 4th semester. Course selection is subject to availability at partner school with advisor approval.
- 7. The total number of elective hours required depends upon the number of hours used to fulfill other degree requirements, including the optional minor or cognate, multiple business majors or the Business Analytics or Sustainability in Business concentration. No courses of a remedial, developmental, skill-acquiring, or vocational nature may apply as credit towards degrees in the Darla Moore School of Business. Coursework in PEDU or MATH/STAT below the Moore School minimum requirements (ex: MATH 111 or STAT 110) or 1 credit performance classes may not be included. Options to meet this requirement may include: pre-professional coursework, an accelerated master's program (maximum of 4 courses if not counted elsewhere in the degree), and Directed Electives (a business section of UNIV 101 is strongly encouraged).
- 8. International Business majors are required to complete a second functional major in the business school. Total program hours and number of courses may vary, depending on the major chosen. Based on choice of major and entering language ability, students may exceed 15 hours some semesters and/or need summer coursework. However, many students bring in AP/IB credit to satisfy some course requirements.
- 9. Functional Courses (3 hours): ACCT 426; IBUS 501, 502, 503, 405 (or MGSC 405), 430, 432; MGMT 406; ECON 503, 504, 505
- 10. Thematic Courses (3 hours): IBUS 422, 423, 424, 425, 426, 427, 428, 429, 431, 433, 434, 435, 519, 521

Program Notes:

- Courses identified as "critical" must be completed with a grade of "C" or better in the student's first year in the Darla Moore School of Business in order to continue in the Business School.
- · Admission to the International Business Eurasian Business major is highly competitive and enrollment is limited.
- Students may pursue a Business Analytics Concentration (9 hours) in conjunction with their functional major.
- Students may choose to complete a **Sustainability in Business Concentration** (12 hours) in conjunction with the International Business major. Courses applied in the major may not also fulfill concentration requirements.
 - o Required: MKTG 472 Business, Markets and Sustainability (3) and IBUS 427 Global Stakeholder Management (3)
 - o Choose 3-6 hours from the following: **ECON** 500, 505, 548; **FINA** 473; **MGMT** 407; **MGSC** 489
 - o Choose 0-3 hours from the following: ENVR 321, 322, 331, 533; GEOG 321; HRTM 485; POLI 478
- Business courses may be repeated only once. Students may appeal to take a course for a third time and must see an advisor to complete the appeal process.
- Students must complete nine hours of international-focused courses. These courses can be satisfied within the 122 required hours and do not require
 additional coursework. At least three credits must be a Business or Economics course at the 300-level or above. The remaining six credits can come
 from: a) two Carolina Core courses OR b) two 200-level or above foreign language course(s) in the same language. For a complete list of the these

- All undergraduate students must take a 3-credit course or its equivalent with a passing grade that covers the founding documents. This course may
 fulfill any requirement in the program of study. Courses that meet this requirement are listed in the academic bulletin.
- The last 30 credit hour in-residence requirement is waived for this program of study.
