The courses listed below will transfer to degree programs within the College of Hospitality, Retail, and Sport Management. This list does not include every technical college course which is available for transfer to USC. You are not required to take all courses listed prior to transferring. Rather, it is a guide for you and your advisors.\* You should be aware that courses must be passed with a grade of C or higher in order to be considered for transfer credit. <p><b>Mathematics and Natural Sciences:</b></p> <p>MAT 130 or 140 plus one of the following options:<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. MAT 122, 141, 240, or 242</li><li>b. MAT 120 or MAT 165</li></ol></p> <p>Two courses from natural science (one must include a lab), selected from:<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. AST 101, 102</li><li>b. BIO 101, 102, 110, 112, 201, 202, 205, 210, 211, 225</li><li>c. CHM 101, 105, 110, 111, 112, 211, 212</li><li>d. PHY 115; or PHY 201, 202, 221, 222</li></ol></p>	<p><b>Mathematics and Natural Sciences (13 hours):</b></p> <p>MATH 122 or 141 <i>plus one of the following:</i><ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. an additional higher mathematics course</li><li>b. a statistics course</li></ol></p> <p>Two courses from natural science (one must include a lab), selected from: ASTR, BIOL, CHEM, MSCI, or PHYS</p>
