



**TRANSFER CREDIT GUIDE:
PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

If you are a South Carolina technical college student who plans to transfer to the University's College of Education, to pursue **a major in Physical Education**, you should consider the following courses as you schedule your technical college classes. The courses listed below will transfer to this degree. This list does not include every technical college course which is available for transfer to the University of South Carolina. You are not required to take all courses listed prior to transferring. Rather, it is a guide for you and your advisors. You should be aware that courses must be passed with a **grade of C or higher** in order to be considered for transfer credit. Please review admissions requirements at www.sc.edu/admissions.

Numerical and Analytical Reasoning Courses:

Option 1: MAT 130 or 140 plus an additional course from:
PHI 105, 106; CPT 101, 111, 112, 114, 211, 233; MAT 120

Option 2: PHI 105 and 106

OR
