

**THE BASICS (or items to make you feel at home):** Alarm clock, umbrella and comfortable shoes. Shorts and T-shirts are acceptable attire for the week. The average temperature in Columbia for June is in the low to mid 90s, but with humidity at or near 100 percent, the heat index often reaches over 100 degrees; in other words, plan to dress cool (but still appropriately).

### **BROADCASTING: MEDIA FUSION AND TRADITIONAL**

- Bring your own or your school's video camera with firewire connection, external microphone, headphones and tripod.

### **DESKTOP PUBLISHING**

- \$15 for a magazine shopping trip.
- Three examples of magazines you think are well-designed.
- A copy of the publication you work on (literary magazine, yearbook, newspaper or all of the above).
- Several high-resolution photos you can use in your designs, supplied on a USB jump drive or on a CD.
- Blank CDs or a jump drive to take your work home.

### **JOURNALISTIC WRITING**

- Notebook, paper and writing utensils.
- Copies of your publication.
- Samples of your writing.
- Laptop computer (if possible).
- Jump drive to take your work home (if possible).

### **NEWSPAPER FEATURE AND OPINION WRITING**

- Copies of your work and publications containing your work.
- Copies of your 2006-2007 newspaper.
- Magazines or other publications containing the types of stories you see yourself completing and/or copies of the type of stories you would like to write eventually.
- If available staff manuals which have job descriptions, editorial policy, publication policy, etc. and staff style sheet.

### **NEWSPAPER EDITORIAL LEADERSHIP**

- Staff manual, school calendar, advertisement policy/ad contract and rate card.
- Copies of your staff's 2006-2007 publications.
- Copies of the best and worst stories in your 2006-2007 publications.
- Copies of at least two stories you have written.
- Notebook, paper and pens/pencils, ruler, layout sheets, magazines to cut up, rubber cement/glue stick, scissors.
- Jump drive to take your work home (if possible).

### **PHOTOJOURNALISM**

- Photojournalism is taught digitally. Some digital cameras are available for use, but bring one (with cables, rechargeable batteries, USB card reader and extra storage cards) if you have one.
- Bring a small notebook and a pen so that you can write down caption information while taking photographs.
- Additional items include electronic flash (if available), 2-3 blank CD-R and samples of photos you've taken for your school publication.

### **PUBLICATION ADVISING**

- Looseleaf notebook (large) with dividers; two blank CD-Rs; highlighters and colored markers.
- Copies of your 2006-2007 newspapers, newsmagazines and/or yearbook.
- Staff manuals (if available) and anything from the publishing kit that looks remotely adviser-ish (yearbook only).
- Copy of your ad contract, publishing contract or printing agreement.
- Any text you will be using.
- 10 copies of a lesson plan or handout you would like to share with classmates.

### **PUBLICATION DESIGN**

- Examples of your publication from the most recent year, particularly things you are proud of design-wise. (This example can be the work of any student – not just student attending camp.)
- Scissors or X-Acto knife.
- Rubber cement or glue stick.
- Laptop computer (if available).
- Ruler, pencil and a LARGE eraser.
- \$10 for a magazine treasure hunt/field trip
- Bring 4-5 well-designed professional publications, that can be cut up. These need to be recent publications – only a few months old. (*Rolling Stone, Entertainment Weekly, Wallpaper, Premiere, Outdoor, Teen People, Sports Illustrated for Kids*)

### **YEARBOOK COVERAGE, CAPTIONS AND VISUALS**

- At least three current magazines from the last month with good design and tons of old magazines.
- Scissors, glue sticks, ruler, pencils, erasers, construction paper, binder and/or folder.

### **YEARBOOK EDITORS/THEME BUILDING**

- Copy of last year's book.
- Layout sheets.
- At least five magazines from the last two months with great graphics.
- Scissors, glue sticks, pica ruler, pencil, large eraser, binder, paper, plastic storage box to carry all your stuff (optional).
- Laptop computer/portable printer (if possible).

**DORM ROOMS WILL HAVE THE FOLLOWING:** Flat sheet, fitted sheet, pillowcase, two towels, one washcloth and one pillow.
