Student must maintain full time status (6 credit hours), display innovation, leadership and professionalism. The award varies in amount, out-of-state residents may qualify for reduced tuition and may be renewable under certain conditions.

Awarded to new and continuing students (freshman, sophomore, junior, senior) majoring in Criminology and Criminal Justice and attending the USC Columbia campus. Criteria used for selection of the J.P. Strom Non-resident Scholar include academic achievement, leadership, and service. The award of \$250 per semester is renewable for up to 3 years as long as the student maintains a minimum "B" average. Only non-residents are eligible to apply under current department guidelines. Recipients of this scholarship will also receive a substantial tuition reduction under existing university rules.

Criteria used for selection of the Meredith Thompson Undergraduate Scholar include academic achievement, leadership, and service to the department or university. The award of \$500 per semester is renewable for up to 3 years as long as the student maintains a minimum "B" average.

The student must declare their intention to continue in the police service career. The award of \$500 per semester is renewable for up to 3 years as long as the student maintains a minimum "B" average.
