TECHNICAL MEDICAL ASSOCIATE III—SIMULATION TECHNICIAN AND PROGRAMMER

The University of South Carolina College of Nursing is seeking applicants for Technical Medical Associate III—Simulation Technician and Programmer. Under general supervision of the Client Simulated Lab Coordinator, the position will coordinate simulation resources, develop simulation scenarios with faculty, expand the use of simulation within the college, and maintain all aspects of technology relating to simulation.

This position works closely and reports to the CSL coordinator on a daily basis. Established policies and procedures are followed, but the person in this position has the independence and discretion to make decisions to fit the occasion. The person in this position should be resourceful, innovative and professional.

Essential Functions:

1. Supervises daily operations in the Client Simulated Lab relating to simulation including setup of the equipment, on site support for faculty utilizing simulation technology, debriefing for the faculty and students, cleanup/maintenance of all equipment relating to simulation, and all troubleshooting of simulation technology.
2. Responsible for programing and testing simulation scenarios that meet faculty criteria and producing concise documentation of these scenarios for distribution throughout the program. This includes regular evaluations and critique of current programs.
3. Serves as the chief mentor for training faculty and students to use simulation technology.
4. Conduct routine equipment maintenance, inventory updates, software updates, orders supplies under guidance from the CSL coordinator and IT director, and makes recommendations to the CSL coordinator for new equipment purchases.

Knowledge/Skills/Expertise Required:

1. Graduation from accredited training program and 4 years experience, or Bachelor's degree and 6 years related experience. Demonstrated skills in Information Technology or a related technology field required. Experience with anatomy and physiology strongly recommended. Ability to learn the needed skill sets required for proficiency in the operation and maintenance of high fidelity medical simulators, task trainers, audiovisual equipment, computers, and all related materials required. Ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing; exercise initiative and make independent decisions; plan and organize simulation operations. The applicant must also establish and maintain effective working relationships.
2. Experience with high fidelity medical simulators, task trainers, audiovisual equipment, computer, advanced simulation resources, moulage techniques is essential.
3. Must be able to work constructively under stress. Work must be detailed as well as creative. Ability to work on multiple concurrent tasks. Must use reasoning skills. Excellent interpersonal skills required.
4. Heavy lifting of up to 100 lbs will be required.
