



TECHNOLOGY CENTER TO PROMOTE HEALTHY LIFESTYLES

The Arnold School of Public Health at the University of South Carolina invites applications for a tenure-track assistant professor position to begin in August 2018. Candidates are sought who will develop collaborative, multidisciplinary research programs using digital health technologies (e.g., eHealth, mHealth, social media, wearables) to promote healthy lifestyles and reduce risk of disease. Scholars with an established research portfolio investigating applications of technology in behavioral interventions, as well as those who consider the policy or economic implications of such interventions are encouraged to apply. Emphasis areas within the Technology Center to Promote Healthy Lifestyles (TecHealth Center) include obesity prevention and treatment, and physical activity promotion; however we have an interest in expanding the scope of our activities to include technology-assisted interventions for other lifestyle behaviors. The TecHealth Center is a South Carolina SmartState Center of Economic Excellence. The Arnold School of Public Health is recognized as a campus leader in community outreach and interdisciplinary scholarship and has ongoing collaborations with many other colleges and schools at the University. The successful candidate will have an earned doctoral degree in a field relevant to the position and evidence of scholarly research, the ability to obtain competitive funding to support a research program and to serve as an effective instructor and mentor. Although not required, completion of a postdoctoral research fellowship is strongly recommended. The successful candidate will have an academic appointment in the department within the Arnold School most closely affiliated with training and expertise. The candidate will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate courses and to mentor students in that department, as well as within the TecHealth Center.
