AY 2023-2024 marked another incredible year of accomplishments in the Center for Integrative and Experiential Learning. You will find highlights of some of our most significant achievements throughout this edition of Distinction.

We celebrated our 10th Year of Graduation with Leadership Distinction throughout 2023 and, by the end of spring 2024, awarded a total of more than 3,800 students with this special academic recognition since announcing our first class of graduates in 2014. I am continually amazed at the breadth and depth of learning that students articulate in their ePortfolios as they connect and integrate within and beyond the classroom experiences. We would not read these students' stories without the people behind the scenes who make it happen. GLD continues to be a shining star because of the investment that Lauren Epps, Sarah Matthews, Gina Spence, and Dr. Matt Childs have made to this program. Their dedication to GLD and passion for its sustained excellence are remarkable.

Among our notable accomplishments, I am excited to announce the launch of the first of several planned alumni awards. In spring 2024, we recognized two GLD alumni from the class of 2014 with our inaugural Distinguished GLD Alumni Award. Look inside to read about our outstanding recipients!

Experience by Design, our institutional Quality Enhancement Plan, successfully reached the midpoint of a five-year implementation and assessment plan under the keen guidance of Dr. Amber Fallucca. This year, the Carolina Engage Grant received a record number of student applications for funding to participate in a lifechanging, beyond the classroom experience. Through the establishment of grant funding programs and reflection resources for faculty and staff, CIEL has supported the development of new projects and enhancement of existing programs to broaden representation of students participating in high impact practices and experiential learning.

It has also been a year of change and growth in CIEL. Amber Fallucca transitioned into a new leadership role on campus as Director of Carolina Experience, while Julie Boyken and Laszlo Folks moved into other positions at USC and UCSD, respectively. We are so grateful for their many contributions to CIEL and Experience by Design. We welcomed four new staff members to our team: Uniqua Jackson, Deidra Pompey, Niky McDonald, and Julia Ballou. Our new-look team remains committed to the mission, vision, and core values of CIEL and to continued service to USC Columbia and the Palmetto College campuses. # QUALITY ENHANCEMENT Plan

CIEL is finishing the third year of Experience by Design, the Quality Enhancement Plan for SACSCOC accreditation. The focus of the QEP at USC Columbia and the Palmetto College Campuses has been student groups that tend to be less engaged beyond the classroom with lower retention and graduation rates, including pell-eligible, transfer students and students identified as men. For 2023-2024 academic year, the focus has been underrepresented minority students.



#### **USC** providing expertise to shape other QEPs

Dr. Amber Fallucca served as a Lead Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) Evaluator for another institution in Georgia in October 2023. In this role, Dr. Fallucca led the SACSCOC Onsite Committee in the review, evaluation, and sharing of feedback to the institutional leadership as it sought to successfully initiate its new QEP.

# **USC QEP AS A MODEL FOR OTHERS**

The progress and success of USC's QEPs, USC Connect and Experience by Design, is being noticed by other institutions during their QEP processes.

#### **North Carolina State University**

Focus was on the design and writing of a successful proposal for a Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) focused on beyond the classroom engagement, experiential learning, and reflection.



#### **Clemson University**

Focus was on the assessment plan and recommendations for sampling student work to evaluate QEP learning outcomes.



#### **Ohio State University**

Focus was on the implementation of scaled ePortfolios across student populations/experiences in support of their general education program.



# USC EXPERIENCE Database

The My USC Experience database is a resource for students to find ways to get involved beyond the classroom and experiential learning opportunities. Examples include student organizations, service-learning, community service, internships, study abroad, and research. Getting involved can help student apply skills learned in the classroom, pursue areas of interest, connect with faculty, staff, and their peers, and shape their career path. Experiences in the database may appear in the My USC Experience co-curricular transcript, a beyond the classroom counterpart to the academic transcript.

## **CAROLINA ENGAGE Grant**

Full-time undergraduate students at USC Columbia and the Palmetto College Campuses can apply for up to \$500 to support beyond the classroom experiences. Eligible expenses include lodging and registration for conferences, travel, and professional clothing. Once awarded, students are required to track and submit expenses and a reflection on the experience. Reflections are submitted via Garnet Gate, and can be done in a number of formats, including essay and video. Reflections are used to assess the learning outcomes of the QEP.

# STUDENT HIGHLIGHT

Ariana Bachini graduated from Indian Land High School and USC Lancaster in spring 2024 with an Associate in Science degree and Leadership Distinction in Research. Ariana received the Carolina Engage Grant to attend the Southeast American College of Sports Medicine Conference in Greenville, SC in February 2024. She travelled to the conference with her research mentor and CIEL Fellow, Dr. Elizabeth Easley, and presented a poster entitled Fat-Free Mass and Handgrip Strength In NJCAA Athletes Based on Self-Reported Strength Training. She also took advantage of the opportunity to learn from other presenters.

Ariana found the entire experience impactful, from applying for the grant, to the conference itself, to the reflection exercise afterward, saying it gave her the opportunity to "truly contemplate what I wanted out of the conference and the reflection allowed me to understand and reflect on what I had experienced. I believe it allowed me to have a deeper understanding of the experience overall." After graduation, she plans to continue her education and pursue a career in medicine.

# **REFLECTION Station**

In partnership with Rhodos Fellows Living Learning Community and the Gamecock iHub, CIEL created a reflection station for students to look back on their various experiences and save video or audio files for future use. Demand for the reflection station continues to grow as more students, faculty, and staff learn about its use and the impact the video recordings have on students.

Individual requests for reflections are facilitated by CIEL staff as well as trained Gamecock iHub interns who guide students during the reflection process by providing structured reflection prompts and serving in an interview method support role.

#### Fall 2023

In Fall 2023, multiple students from the TRIO Opportunity Scholars Program and a psychology course utilized the station to reflect on their coursework.

#### Spring 2024

In Spring 2024, the reflection station was used during Capstone's Hot Cookie Friday event, the College of Arts and Sciences' SC State Agency Industry Day internship and networking event, as well as a South Carolina Honors College archeology course.

# **GRADUATION WITH**Leadership Distinction


Graduation with Leadership Distinction (GLD) is an official academic distinction USC undergraduate students may earn acknowledging both within and beyond the classroom learning. Students reflect on these experiences, connect them, and articulate their meaning and key lessons learned through integrative learning.

Through integrating these experiences while developing the ePortfolio for GLD, students demonstrate critical thinking, written and verbal communication, as well as problem solving and leadership skills. The ePortfolio can help graduates navigate the next steps after graduation!

After a student earns GLD, it appears on their official USC transcript and diploma. They also receive as garnet, black, and white cords to wear at graduation. GLD graduates stand out from their peers at graduation and beyond.

GLD recognizes integrative learning, defined by the American Association of Colleges and Universities, as:

Integrative learning is an understanding and a disposition that a student builds across the curriculum and co-curriculum, from making simple connections among ideas and experiences to synthesizing and transferring learning to new, complex situations within and beyond the campus.

#### Aneesa Zahran | Fall 2023 | Nursing

Aneesa volunteered at the Columbia Islamic School in addition to completing nursing clinicals, working at EdVenture Children's Museum, and participating in the Prisma Health Scholar Program. She pursued GLD to reflect on these experiences, saying "It had been such a long journey and I wanted to embark on a project that would feel like a proper conclusion to my time at university." Aneesa currently works as a nurse in Florida, applying the lessons she learned from her experiences at Carolina. One key lesson the distinction between equity and equality when serving a wide range of patients and the importance of an equitable approach to patient care. Of GLD, Aneesa states "It is a great way to reflect on the experiences you had and derive greater meanings from them than you may have even realized!"



#### Nazharee Cloude | Spring 2024 | Biological Sciences

In addition to volunteering at the Free Medical Clinic in Columbia and participating in medical mission trips in Central America, Nazharee studied the effect of implicit bias on Black maternal health. She pursued GLD in Diversity and Social Advocacy because it not only "connected my experiences, but

also portrayed who I am and my efforts in life and academia perfectly." After graduation, she plans on attending medical school and becoming a physician, where she will apply her insights based on her experiences at USC, including actively challenging the perpetuation of stereotypes in order to provide equitable care. Of GLD, Nazharee says "My experience not only helped me better recognize how beautifully impactful my journey has been throughout college but highlighted the values I want to carry forward!"



#### **Brooke Patton | Spring 2024 | International Business**

Brooke participated in the Darla Moore School of Business Responsible International Leadership Cohort program, studying abroad at ESSEC Business school in France in 2022. Brooke also traveled to 18 countries in Europe, immersing herself in new cultural experiences through the lens of the locals. After returning to the U.S., she reflected on her travels through GLD. Brooke wrote about the importance of international relationships in an interconnected global world and experiencing cultures other than one's own. She is now finishing the accelerated Master of International Business program at Darla Moore School of Business. Of GLD, she states "It's a remarkable opportunity to deepen your understanding of yourself and your experiences."



#### Kaleb Phelps | Fall 2023 | Public Health

At USC, Kaleb was involved as Vice President of the Beta Nu Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., University Ambassador, and had an hospital internship. He pursued GLD because it would allow him to reflect on what he gained during college and how he could apply those lessons in the future. He shares that "GLD challenged me to reflect, and notice how lessons from my coursework were applicable in my leadership, work, and internship experiences." Upon reflecting on his experiences, Kaleb evaluated his critical thinking and argumentation skills, and their importance to his future in laws school and as an attorney. In addition to reflecting on how his experiences have prepared him for the future, Kaleb shares purusing GLD "allowed me to look back and cherish everything that I had accomplished in my 3.5 years at Carolina!"



# Cameron McDuffie | Spring 2024 | Integrated Information Technology

While earning his degree, Cameron did cybersecurity research, worked in IT, and took advantage of job shadowing and conference opportunities. He pursued GLD to dive further into his field of study and reflect on how the pieces connect, stating "It's one thing to learn something in the classroom, but an entirely different thing to use that same concept in practice." He credits his U401 instructor with helping him make invaluable connections between experiences; "my UNIV 401 professor was one of the greatest teachers I've had throughout my college experience. He encouraged me to dig deeper and find real meaning in my experiences, and it paid off." Cameron currently works as an IT Manager at USC.

## **GLD** Events

#### **Write Nite** October 4, 2023 and February 20, 2024 | Patterson Hall

Write Nite is an event hosted by CIEL for students working on their ePortfolio, the culminating project to earn GLD. Write Nite provides students with a dedicated time and space to write, as well as writing assistance. CIEL advisors and Peer Writing Lab Tutors from the Student Success Center help students through brainstorming, reviewing essays, and providing feedback.



At the GLD Cording Ceremony, spring graduates earning GLD are recognized for their accomplishment and receive their GLD cord. University administration, CIEL partners, and friends and family of the graduates participate are invited and celebrate at a reception afterward.

We believe students learn best through their experiences and subsequently reflecting on those experiences facilitated within and beyond the classroom.

The purpose of GLD advising is to help students gain awareness of opportunities and make connections between experiences to inform decisions in the future. GLD advisors facilitate "Intro to GLD" meetings which cover topics such as identification of resources, specific requirements to earn GLD, and the GLD application process. Advisors also facilitate ePortfolio meetings which support students actively working towards the ePortfolio requirement through discussions of drafts, feedback, and the GLD ePortfolio rubric.

#### **Intro Advising**

Advisors meet with students anytime from their first year to the beginning of their final semester. We customize our approach to each student, but generally we learn about what a student is involved in, as well as their interests for future involvement and goals. We connect them to the offices and resources to help them get involved. We discuss which GLD pathway is the best fit, the requirements, and plan to complete them. For seniors, we finalize the GLD application and plan for the presentation and ePortfolio requirements.

#### ePortfolio Advising

The ePortfolio is the culminating project of GLD. It is a website where students articulate transformative learning that has taken place for them throughout their experiences at the University of South Carolina. Students write 5 essays, three of which are focused on specific lessons learned from reflecting on and connecting coursework with BTC experiences. There are two methods of support for students: University 401 for GLD and structured advisement.

#### **UNIV 401**

University 401 for GLD is a 1-credit hour course designed to support students through the process of creating the ePortfolio in the fall or spring of the final year of their undergraduate studies. It is offered in full semester, half semester, and online formats. It is even offered in the summer!

#### Structured Advising

Sometimes, students aren't able to take UNIV 401! That's where structured advisement comes in. Structured advisement is an 8 week process in which students meet with CIEL advisors, Faculty Fellows, and/or trained university staff partners. Students meet with their advisor 3 times – twice in a small group setting and once in one-on-one meeting to discuss progress and essay drafts.



#### **LinkedIn Group**



One reason students pursue GLD is to connect with other student leaders, who later become leaders in their fields and communities. #### **Alumni Award**

The first Distinguished GLD Alumni Award was awarded in spring 2024. Members of the first class of GLD, who graduated in 2014, were eligible to receive the award. The premise of GLD is integrative learning, which means making connections between experiences to solve problems and lead. The award recognizes the sustained commitment to making a difference by using resources to positively impact others in any capacity in any community. This year, there were two recipients of the Distinguished GLD Alumni Award, Dr. John Clegg, Assistant Professor of Biomedical Engineering at the University of Oklahoma and Coy Gibson, Director of Finance and Operations in the Anne Frank Center at USC. The recipients received a plaque and were recognized at the 2024 GLD Cording Ceremony.

#### **Student Advisory Council (SAC)**

SAC is a focus group of students for CIEL who positively impact the learning environment at USC. Members provide student perspectives and valuable insight on a variety of CIEL initiatives and resources including, but not limited to, experiential learning, integrative learning, GLD, and the development of CIEL in relation to USC's Quality Enhancement Plan. # Digital Accessibility in Social Media and Marketing: CIEL's Efforts Toward Inclusivity

Digital accessibility is the implementation of intentional adaptations and accommodations within the digital space to ensure that people with various disabilities are included and can effectively utilize online resources.

This past academic year, we have been brainstorming ways to increase our accessibility in the digital space and beyond. In March 2024, we held a sandbox session to discuss our current support for students with disabilities pursuing GLD and where we can improve these efforts. We also began experimenting throughout our social media and marketing with different ways to produce ALT-text, Closed-Captioning, and audio narration for our videos. Finally, we are practicing higher consciousness of the needs of the visually impaired in our design process, focusing on color-blind friendly and high-contract color palettes.
