- **Fraternity or Sorority Life chapter leadership**: You are required to get a signature from your chapter advisor. CIEL does not accept students verifying experiences for other students (such as chapter presidents). Obtain supervisor signature (digital or physical).
- **Student organization leadership roles** <u>without advisors</u>: Fill out the student and experience information **ONLY** and provide student signature (you are not required to provide supervisor information).
