1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 3.000 cumulative LIFE and Institutional GPA.
2. Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
3. Students who do not place into the required ARP courses must complete the necessary prerequisites before continuing with the required Carolina Core ARP courses.
4. Students in the College of Nursing are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language by a score of 2 or higher on the foreign language placement test, or credit equivalent to USC 109 and 110 courses, or credit equivalent to the USC 121 course.
5. The [Carolina Core](#) provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
6. No elective courses of a remedial and developmental nature may apply as credit toward the 120 hours minimum.

### Program Notes:

- Students must have a “C” or better grade in all critical courses and a cumulative 3.000 or higher progression, institutional, and LIFE GPA in order to be eligible to apply to Upper Division. Grade forgiveness will not be recognized in the GPA calculation.
- Admission into the baccalaureate degree in nursing major does not guarantee admission to the upper division. Admission to the upper division is a competitive process and the meeting of minimum admission criteria (GPA 3.0) does not guarantee admission to the upper division. Students who are not accepted to the upper division should talk with their advisor regarding the feasibility of reapplication. If the student chooses to reapply to upper division, the student must submit a new application for the next admission date and must compete with the new applicant group.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
