This area of focus in entrepreneurship designation does not appear on the student's academic transcript, nor on the diploma. Major courses that are acceptable for credit toward this area of focus are identified in the academic bulletin by appearing with the designation ( $E$ ) after the name of the course.
9. Students wishing an area of focus in Entrepreneurship should take PALM 494.
