FIRST YEARS ON PROBATION

First-Year Freshmen Academic Recovery Program

First-year freshmen who have less than a 2.00 Total Institutional GPA at the end of their first semester of collegiate enrollment are considered at risk. During the first six weeks of their second semester, these students must participate in an academic coaching session before being eligible to register for courses for the third semester. These sessions will provide students with assistance in academic planning, general advisement, major exploration, degree audit, self-assessments, and success strategies. This requirement is in addition to any made by the student's college, school, or academic program.

FYPs End of Fall Semester	253	375	48% increase
FYPs Enrolled Spring Semester	198	296	49.5% increase



TRANSFERS ON PROBATION*

	Fall 2019	Fall 2020	% Change
Transfers on Probation End of Fall Semester	99	107	8% increase
Transfers of Probation Enrolled Spring Semester	79	73	7.5% decrease

*Transfers on Probation are encouraged, but not required, to attend Academic Coaching



KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Largest FYP population since policy's inception (2008)
- Spring FYP enrollment increased by +40 students between Jan 1 and Jan 20 (first day after add/drop)
 - Non-registered students initiative
- 66% of FYPs have either attended or scheduled required Coaching appointment as of Feb 17
