


2022-2023 ACADEMIC YEAR STATISTICS



- Total Appointments Held: 7,651
 - 6% increase over 3 year average
- Total Unique Students Seen: 4,746
 - 19% of undergraduate population (OIRAA spring 2023 enrollment data)
 - 4.5% increase over 3 year average
- EA Team Member Averages:
 - 1,093 appointments per advisor
 - 678 unique students per advisor



FALL 2023 STATISTICS



- Total Appointments: 3,748
- Unique Students: 2,921
- EA Team Averages:
 - 416 appointments per advisor
 - 325 students per advisor
- Primary Advising Support:
 - CAS (5 Majors)
 - ASPH (3 Majors)



CAS UNDECLARED EXPLORATORY ADVISORS

- Each year, Travis and Alexis advise a caseload that is an average of <u>128%</u> of their max caseload size
- Complexity, difficult conversations, longer advising appointments (45 mins)
- Additional primary advising support:
 - CAS Economics
 - Philosophy
 - Religious Studies


INTER-COLLEGE MAJOR MIGRATIONS

Student Comings and Goings, Last Academic Year and Last Semester







Average 1 Year Retention Rate, Students in Compliance: 67% (2018-present)


Spring 2024 FY freshmen on probation: 179

CENTRALIZING MAJOR CHANGE WHO IS IT GOOD FOR?

Students!

- In one appointment they get:
 - Major program overview/comparison
 - Major change requirements check
 - Course requirements
 - Progression standards
 - Existing credit analysis
 - College requirements
 - College fees
 - College/department messaging & info
 - Estimated time to graduation
 - Course advisement
 - Advisement hold lifting

Advisors, Admin Staff, and Colleges!

- Significant reduction in time, job tasks, and administrative burden, e.g.
 - New major info sessions (scheduling, planning, hosting)
 - Prospective major screening for eligibility
 - Existing credit analysis for prospective students
 - Advising for upcoming semester
 - CCR processing
- Program growth
- Centralized MC process customized according to college needs, wants
