Chair Whittle stated the projects were approved and would be presented on the Finance and Infrastructure written consent agenda for consideration by the full Board at its meeting later in the day.



Taylor House Interior Renovation









Action Requested: Approval is requested to establish and fully fund this project with a budget of \$2,500,000 funded with \$1,500,000 of Private Gifts and \$1,000,000 of Institutional Funds (School of Law).

ACTION ITEM: Full Approval

Project Description:

This final phase of renovation will complete the interior upfit providing offices, meeting spaces, restrooms and an elevator. Exterior and interior restoration and replacement of mechanical / electrical infrastructure occurred in previous phases. After this phase is completed, the building will be occupied and accommodate programs for the School of Law. The renovated Taylor House will be the home of:

- Law Enforcement Leadership
- South Carolina Law Initiative
- Constitutional Law Center
- Small and Family Business Initiative



Jones PSC Third Floor Renovation for Instructional Biology Labs



ACTION ITEM: Full Approval

Project Description:

The project will renovate a large portion of the south wing, third floor, to replace aged and unused chemistry labs with modern instructional biology labs and preparation rooms. The project will provide new mechanical/electrical infrastructure, new lab casework, and new classroom A/V technology. This renovation is part of the multi-year plan to increase the quantity and quality of instructional science labs on campus in response to enrollment growth and demand from colleges with curriculums that require science lab courses.


Action Requested: Approval is requested to establish and fully fund this project with a budget of \$4,900,000 funded with Institutional Capital Project Funds.




USC Upstate Library/Classroom Building Expansion and Renovation










Action Requested: Approval is requested to establish and fully fund this project with a budget of \$21,000,000 funded with State Appropriated Funds.

ACTION ITEM: Full Approval

Project Description:

The project will expand and modernize the Library/Classroom Building with an estimated 22,000 gross square foot addition and renovate the second floor of the existing building. The addition will emphasize flexible space with 5-6 large multipurpose rooms and needed academic/study space. The renovation of the existing building will repurpose some classrooms to become space for archives and special collections, a reading room, quiet study rooms, and space for student projects to include a Digital Commons Lab. Replacement of the HVAC system will also occur.
