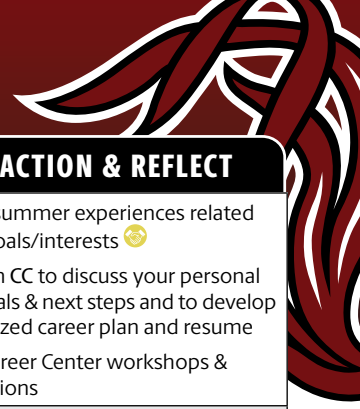


4-YEAR STUDENT CAREER PLAN

	KNOW YOURSELF
1ST YEAR: BUILD FOUNDATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify your career goals and take career & personality assessments to understand your skills, interests, values and strengths Check your major map & verify all first year academic grade requirements Examine success/support options like the Office of Student Advocacy
2ND YEAR: EXPLORE POSSIBILITIES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take the GradStats personality assessment & review your custom personality report Reflect on your experiences and skills in relation to career goals and update your resume Review skills to see what areas need more development
3RD YEAR: FIND FOCUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check in with your advisor to ensure you are on track for graduation Discuss with a CC or PPA how your 2nd year & summer experiences have better equipped you for success Reflect on your experiences and skills and update your resume
4TH YEAR: PREPARE FOR LAUNCH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reflect on & update your profile/ professional documents online Meet with a CC or PPA to prepare an approach for your final year If not attending grad school, meet with your CC to explore various career options

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Explore what you can do with your major online Visit Garnet Gate & the August Student Org Fair to explore and join clubs or orgs for your major Attend the Part-Time Job Fair in the fall/spring
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Consider a minor and take courses that will expand your skill development Attend graduate or professional school events or employer events to learn about different career paths Attend career & internship fairs to gain exposure to programs/jobs Explore study abroad/exchange programs for a global perspective Consider applying to and participating in the Summer Research Program Attend Career Center workshops & presentations
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Connect with USC alumni on LinkedIn and start a conversation Explore courses, trainings or certifications to enhance skills and knowledge Attend panels, workshops and immersion experiences to gain confidence & grow connections Follow employers of interest
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Research online to know more about the companies and positions you are interested in, and explore career paths, job titles and salaries Conduct a senior audit to make sure you meet graduation requirements Attend fairs & events to gain information about specific jobs, programs & opportunities

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Engage in extracurricular activities to network & develop skills Get involved to build your eight Career Competencies that employers look for Volunteer with charitable organizations by connecting with the Leadership and Service Center
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take advantage of Beyond the Classroom events Consider a summer internship and/or participate in job shadowing Participate in a formal mentoring program through MentorshipHub Connect with former supervisors on LinkedIn and ask them to write a recommendation for you on the site
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Secure a summer internship/co-op, micro-internship, job shadowing or other experiential learning opportunity If considering graduate/professional school, prepare for entrance exams, and contact Pre-Professional & Graduate School Advising for assistance with admission requirements Explore research opportunities Join professional organizations related to your specific interests
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask your key connections to write letters of support or serve as references Join professional associations or online forums related to your career interests or academic field Search for jobs Join online groups focused on specific careers or topics of interest

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Look for summer experiences related to your goals/interests Meet with CC to discuss your personal brand, goals & next steps and to develop a customized career plan and resume Attend Career Center workshops & presentations
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review your personal brand, goals & next steps with a CC or PPA Engage in interview preparation & practice — create a document with your most relevant experiences and apply the STAR method Start or continue volunteering with relevant organizations Conduct Informational Interviews with alumni & professionals in the field
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review your online presence Identify faculty, staff or supervisors who can serve as references for you Explore the Career Center Toolbox for additional career readiness resources Research education requirements for careers of interest
