## **Methodology for Emergency Financial Aid Grants Under Section 314(a)(1) of the ARP Act**

### USC Upstate ARP Act Funds Award Methodology

USC Upstate awarded students that had completed the 20-21 FAFSA, and were enrolled as degree seeking students. Pell Grant recipients were awarded \$1050, if enrolled in 12 hours and \$700 if enrolled in less than 12 hours. Eligible Non-Pell students with an EFC less than or equal to \$10,000 were awarded \$700, if enrolled in at least 12 hours and \$300 if enrolled in less than 12 hours. Non-Pell students with an EFC greater than \$10,000 were awarded \$500 if enrolled in 12 hours and \$300 if enrolled in less than 12 hours. Graduate students were awarded \$300.
