	A.3.1 Qualifications and requirements Faculty are university personnel who are engaged in research, instruction both inside
	and outside the classroom, service and/or administration. Faculty can be further classified as having tenure-track, professional-track, or honorific appointments. Faculty titles and qualifications for appointment are described below and in further detail in policy ACAF 1.06 Academic Titles for Faculty and Unclassified Academic Staff Positions. Tenure-Track appointments are regular, full-time faculty appointments of individuals who typically have an earned doctorate or a terminal degree; see section B. Professional-track faculty are appointed on an annual or multi-year basis. See also policy ACAF 1.16 Professional-Track Faculty; see section C.
	A visiting faculty appointment is a full-time appointment, usually for no more than two years, of an individual who either has academic rank or high professional status at a different institution or organization and is on leave of absence from their home organization or is qualified for but does not currently serve in an academic position. An individual appointed as an adjunct faculty member serves as an honorary member of the faculty of a department, school, or college. Emeritus titles can be awarded to any tenure-track or professional-track faculty at the time of retirement when formally requested and approved by the chief academic officer of the faculty member's academic unit, the president and the Board of Trustees; see section A.5.
