Significant events during the academic year:

- A Faculty Manual bylaws change was passed in Faculty Senate to increase the number of C&C voting members from nine (eight elected plus one representative from Palmetto College) to 13 (12 elected plus one representative from Palmetto College). This change will allow for greater representation from campus units and support a subcommittee structure to streamline committee work.
- The Faculty Senate Committee on Instructional Development (InDev), with significant input from Curricula & Courses and other stakeholders, passed through Faculty Senate a procedure to integrate shared governance into the process of adding online delivery to existing programs.
