CIEE COVID-19 VACCINATION POLICY

We at CIEE value beyond any other consideration the health and safety of all members of our worldwide community, including program participants, staff, instructors, and homestay families.

Our mission is to humanize international relations and foster peace through international education and exchange programs that promote intercultural understanding. And we cannot continue bringing the world together in a way that honors our ideals if we do not do all we can to minimize the risk of spreading COVID-19 and its variants between and within the communities in which we live and work.

Alongside our other prevention measures, vaccination significantly increase protection for all members of the CIEE community. Therefore, we are requiring all members of the CIEE community, including all American students traveling abroad, exchange visitors coming to the U.S., homestay families, and international and domestic CIEE staff to be fully vaccinated no later than January 1, 2022.





COVID-19 IN MOROCCO

- Morocco has administered at least 38,436,040 doses of COVID vaccines so far. Assuming every person needs 2 doses, that's enough to have vaccinated about 52.7% of the country's population.
- As COVID-19 infections began to be reported around the world, many countries responded by shutting down places like schools, workplaces and international borders in order to contain the spread of the virus.

Average number of new infections reported each day in Morocco falls by more than **3,500** over the last 3 weeks, 35% of its previous peak

COVID-19 infections are decreasing in Morocco, with **1,847** new infections reported on average each day. That's 19% of the peak — the highest daily average reported on August 9.

There have been **923,924** infections and **14,040** coronavirus-related deaths reported in the country since the pandemic began.




TRAVEL GRANT
