

Excellence in Teaching Award Review Form

College Deans or Chief Academic Officers were asked to submit one nomination per college or university to include the nominee's resume/CV, course syllabus, teaching evaluation, and a personal statement. Each nomination may also include letter(s) of recommendation.

After reading through the nominations, please score each nominee in the four required areas and select one category to evaluate them on as described below. The maximum score for any candidate is 50.

Score the following categories, on a scale from 1 to 10 (10 being the highest score).

Each of the nominees will be based upon the selection criteria below.

Nominations must show evidence of excellence in all of the required categories and one of the three other categories.

Required Categories

Develops Success in the Classroom and Beyond: Provides students with tools necessary for success in the educational environment.

Develops Students' Personal Strategies: Challenges students to maximize their potential by helping students to identify their own personal strengths and learning styles.

Incorporates Innovation in Teaching: Acknowledges and caters to a variety of student learning styles and changing student needs by incorporating activities or pedagogy, content and activities that enrich and expand upon base-level course objectives.

Does the nominee encourage an environment that is diverse, inclusive, and equitable?

Other categories (nomination must include one of these):

Choose one category that was included in the nomination and score it on a scale from 1 to 10.

Category:

1. Develops Critical and Analytical Thinking: Challenges students to enhance critical thinking and analytical thinking skills.
2. Fosters Student Involvement in the Community: Encourages and supports students in maximizing resources and opportunities available in their local and global community.
3. Supports Effective Utilization of Campus Resources: Encourages and supports students in maximizing resources and opportunities available through their institution.
