

Joel H. Samuels is Professor of Law and Director of the Rule of Law Collaborative at the University of South Carolina. Since 2004, Professor Samuels has taught in the areas of civil procedure and international law. He was honored by the USC School of Law student body in 2007 and 2016 as the Outstanding Faculty Member for teaching excellence. Professor Samuels is a lead author on the South Carolina Civil Procedure Handbook published by the South Carolina Bar. He also is a lead author of one of the premier casebooks on international law, Transnational Law (West Academic Press). His scholarship explores the challenges and opportunities presented by changing notions of sovereignty, and his written work addresses international boundary disputes, maritime piracy, and cross-border litigation. As Director of the Rule of Law Collaborative, Professor Samuels oversees programming focused on rule of law development across the globe. Over the past five years, he has turned ROLC into one of the leading academic rule of law centers in the United States, increasing its budget nearly twenty-fold through grants and fundraising while developing innovative and sustainable programming both at home and abroad. Before joining the School of Law, Professor Samuels clerked for Judge Barry Ted Moskowitz of the Southern District of California, practiced as a litigator at Covington & Burling, worked at the World Bank, and taught at the University of Michigan. Professor Samuels received his A.B. in politics, *magna cum laude*, from Princeton University in 1994. He received his J.D., *cum laude*, from the University of Michigan Law School in 1999, where he was a Clarence Darrow Scholar. While at Michigan, he also earned a master's degree in Russian and East European Studies.
