Lisa Hammond is a poet and professor at the University of South Carolina Lancaster, and the author of *Moving House*, a collection of poems published by Texas Review Press. Her poems are grounded in the sometimes haunted landscapes of South Carolina, a setting rich with the flavors of ripe

peaches and tomatoes and fresh caught shrimp. Her poetry explores the intersections between story, art, history, family, and memory. Whether she writes about the remapping of the state line between the two Carolinas, archeological excavations of historic sites along the Pee Dee river, or the blooming of the Catawba spider lilies every summer, poet and novelist Ron Rash has observed that her work “illuminates the small wonders that surround us.”
