

Assessing Information Literacy in FYE

Identify your driving question

What do you hope to learn? What question is driving your assessment?

Identify stakeholders

Who will be interested in the results of this assessment?

Among the stakeholders, who are 2-5 people sufficiently invested in this project to do the bulk of the work? (working group)

Among the stakeholders, whose buy-in could you increase by having them sign off on the process at various intervals along the way?

Developing student learning outcomes/goals

Traditional education	Constructivist education
Filling students with knowledge/information	Building knowledge through real life experience
Knowledge goals: What do students know?	Outcomes: What can students do?
Assessment tools: Tests, quizzes	Assessment tools: Rubrics

What framework for assessment already exists on campus?

Be sure your assessment plan includes:

- Data collection
- Data analysis
- Dissemination of results
- Implementation of changes/interventions
 - How will the results be used to improve teaching and learning?
- Re-assessment to determine effectiveness of interventions
- Timeline
- Responsible parties
