



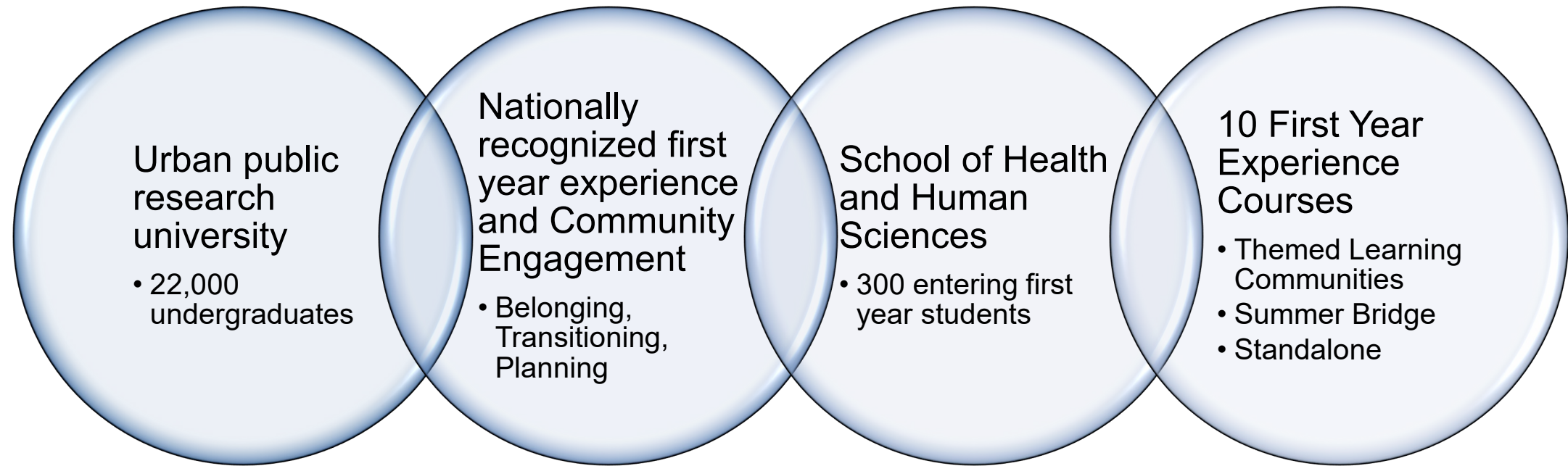

- 3. Identify campus programs and resources related to academic, professional, and social development.*





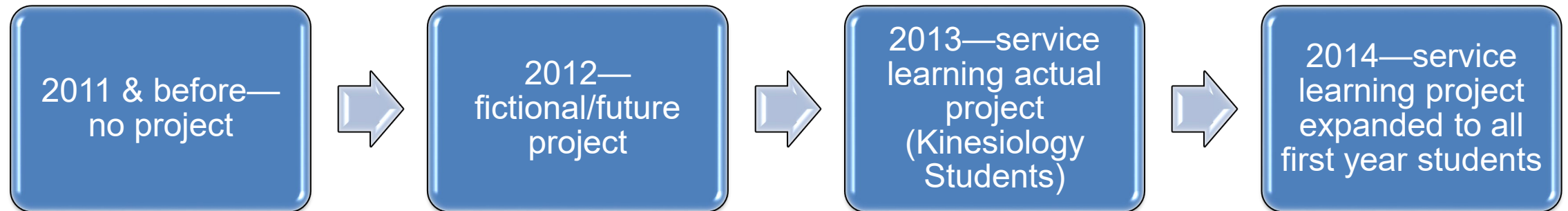
Defining Belonging

Beyond Monumental

Monumental Kids Movement

- 7-9 week youth running program that culminates with the CNO Financial Indianapolis Monumental Marathon in November
- Started in 2012 with one school and 150 IPS students (IPS #19)
- In 2017, 60 Marion County schools participated and had 1739 running program graduates
- In 2018, the goal is to have 1,800 running program graduates and 65 schools

Overview of Service Learning Project

- Piloted the project with three first year seminar courses in 2013
- Students completed a 6-week before or after school program culminating with a 5k or 1 mile race at the Indianapolis Monumental Marathon
 - IUPUI students signed up to attend one of the participating IPS schools one day a week for approximately 1 hour
 - PE teacher or other teacher at the site runs the program with the assistance of other teachers and the IUPUI students
 - Running activities and games to promote movement and fun



Logistics of the Project

- Working with IPS liaison to coordinate all the school days and times
- Create a sign up procedure
- Meet with each first year class to schedule/train students
- Background Checks
- Scheduling reminders
- Working through the various hiccups
- Coordinate day of race activities (IPS, IUPUI, BM)



Semester Overview

- Week 2 of class Casey gives an overview of partner organization
- Week 4 project coordinator comes to class to work through online scheduling (and issues) background checks, shirt sizes
- Weeks 5-10 student attend individual service learning visits
- Week 7 mid project reflection and check in
- Week 10 give final details and event day instructions
- Week 11 Event!!
- Week 12 event debrief and reflection
- Week 14 final project due

Challenges

- Transportation of the IUPUI students
- Background checks
- Registration/technology
- Outside of class time
- Working with an outside organization
- Alternative assignment
- Times available for students (could conflict with college class schedule)
- Lead teachers occasionally absent
- Difference in IPS/IUPUI school schedules (school breaks)
- Getting the students to the race (early)

Tips/Suggestions for Implementation

- Be flexible!
- Identify possible partnerships and key stakeholders associated
- Develop a manageable time frame
- Start small (one school before ten)

- Administrative support
