#### **PURPOSE**

Title IV of the Higher Education Act requires all institutions that process U.S. federal student aid to disclose semiannually to the U.S. Department of Education specific financial transactions with Foreign Sources, pursuant to Section 117 (20 U.S.C. 1011f). The is purpose of this policy is to outline reporting obligations for the University of South Carolina for all institutions, units, and individuals receiving contracts and gifts from foreign sources.

#### **DEFINITIONS AND ACRONYMS**

<u>Foreign Source</u> – <u>By example, aAny</u> one of the following are considered a foreign source: 1) a foreign government, including an agency of a foreign government; 2) a legal entity, governmental or otherwise, created solely under the laws of a foreign state or states; 3) an individual who is not a citizen or a national of the United States or a trust territory or protectorate thereof; and 4) an agent, including a subsidiary or affiliate of a foreign legal entity, acting on behalf of a foreign source.

<u>Contract</u> – Any agreement for the acquisition by purchase, lease, or barter of property or services by the <del>Foreign sSource, for the direct benefit or use of either of the parties.</del>

<u>Gift</u> – The voluntary transfer of money or property by a <u>f</u>Foreign Source made without consideration.—. Consideration refers to a "bargained-for-exchange" – anything of value provided or promised in the exchange.

Restricted or Conditional Gift or Contract - Any endowment, gift, grant, contract, award, present, or property or any kind which includes provisions regarding: A) the employment, assignment, or termination of faculty; B) the establishment of departments, centers, research or lecture programs, or new faculty positions; C) the selection or admission of students; or D) the award of grants, loans, scholarships, fellowships, or other forms of financial aid restricted to students or a specified country, religion, sex, ethnic origin, or political opinion.

### POLICY STATEMENT

This policy sets forth required reporting as required in Section 117 (20 U.S.C. 1011f). The University will review the receipt of all foreign contracts and gifts semiannually in accordance with Section 117 (20 U.S.C. 1011f). If the total value received from foreign contract

and gifts is, alone or combined, is \$250,000 or more within a calendar year, the University

Controller's Office will file a disclosure report with the U.S. Secretary of Education on or before

January 31<sup>st</sup> and July 31<sup>st</sup> of each year for the respective six-month reporting period.

These disclosure requirements were enacted to promote public transparency about the role of foreign funding in U.S. higher education.
