

<u>AMENDMENT NO. 3</u>

This Amendment No. 3 modifies the Invitation for Bid only in the manner and to the extent as stated herein.

- **ITEM ONE: DEADLINE FOR RECEIPT OF BIDS EXTENDED** Must submit offer by May 20, 2014, 3:00 PM
- **ITEM TWO:** AWARD POSTING EXTENDED Award posting has been extended until May 21, 2014.
- **ITEM THREE: CLARIFICATION: SUBMITTING AMENDMENTS AFTER BID HAS BEEN SUBMITTED** The Invitation for Bid is a Sealed Bid. Any amendments submitted with the bid must also be in a sealed envelope. USC does not have a way to accept electronically sealed bids or amendments associated with a sealed bid.

ITEM FOUR: CORRECTION TO AMENDMENT NO. 1 2nd Vendor question asked if any furniture pieces were built in or if they were all standalone pieces. The answer stated: Both. Correction: Furniture is freestanding only.

ITEM FIVE: VENDOR QUESTIONS / CLARIFICATION

QUESTION:

Please provide pictures of the dressers and mirrors. <u>ANSWER</u> Image is not available.

QUESTION:

Who is the manufacturer of the furniture? Please provide website or other contact info. (This is necessary for some parts replacement.)

ANSWER:

Manufacturer unknown.

QUESTION:

As some of the items are supposed to be "built-in", please describe what is meant by "built-in". In other words, does this mean some items are "built into the walls of the apartments"?

ANSWER:

All furniture is freestanding.

QUESTION:

As some furniture is in a warehouse and some remain in apartments, please identify quantities of each item that are still in apartments.

ANSWER:

Approximately 70% of the furniture is in apartments which will be vacant during the work.

QUESTION:

Is there a percentage of cost threshold whereby an item is deemed too expensive to repair and refinish? If so, what is that percentage?

ANSWER:

No, it is assumed all will be repaired and are repairable.

QUESTION:

As some of the items are in a warehouse, are we to include the labor for staging these items, if they are stacked? If so, how many items and what items are stacked one on another?

ANSWER:

For the items in the warehouse: Desks are stacked two high. Desk chairs – stacked two high. Desk Hutch, stacked 3-4 high. All other items are not stacked.

QUESTION:

If the warehoused items are on racks, who is responsible for lowering to the ground, so that repairs and refinishing can be accomplished?

ANSWER:

The Contractor is responsible.

QUESTION:

If the contractor is responsible for removing items from racks, are they responsible for replacing them back on racks? Ditto, stacking?

ANSWER:

Yes, the Contractor is responsible for restacking after approval of refinishing.

QUESTION:

If warehoused material is on racks, what quantities are on second tier or higher?

ANSWER:

There are no racks.

QUESTION:

Can another site visit be arranged, both at the warehouse and at the apartments? **ANSWER:** No additional site visits will be held.

BIDDER SHALL ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF AMENDMENT NO. 3 IN THE SPACE PROVIDED BELOW AND RETURN IT **WITH THEIR BID RESPONSE**. FAILURE TO DO SO MAY SUBJECT BID TO REJECTION.
