Award will be made in accordance with Section 11-35-1550 of the South Carolina Consolidated Procurement Code.

Payment will be made in accordance with Section 11-35-45 of the South Carolina Consolidated Procurement Code and Disbursement Regulations. Delay in receiving invoices, as well as errors and omissions on the invoices, will be considered just cause for withholding payment without losing discount privileges. The University reserves the right to withhold payment or make such deductions as may be necessary to protect the University from loss or damage because of defective work, claims, damages, or to pay for repair of correction of materials furnished hereunder.

Quoted prices must remain firm for a period of thirty days beyond the RFQ deadline.

FOB Destination. Destination is the shipping dock of the University of South Carolina's designated receiving site, or other location, as specified herein.

#### **DEFAULT AND TERMINATION**

The University may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the contractor, or if the contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the state, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the University will not be liable to the contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the contractor will be liable to the University for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the University improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience. In case of default by the contractor, the University reserves the right to purchase any or all items in default in the open market, charging the contractor with any additional costs. The defaulting contractor shall not be considered a responsible bidder until the assessed charge has been satisfied. In the event that this contract is terminated or cancelled upon request and for the convenience of the University, it may negotiate reasonable termination costs, if applicable.

### PREFERENCES – RESIDENT VENDOR PREFERENCE (SEP 2009)

## PREFERENCES – SC/US END PRODUCT (SEP 2009)

Section 11-35-1524 provides a preference to vendors offering South Carolina end-products or US end-products, if those products are made, manufactured, or grown in SC or the US, respectively. An end-product is the tangible project identified for acquisition in this solicitation, including all component parts in final form and ready for the use intended. The terms "made," "manufactured," and "grown" are defined by Section 11-35-1524(A). By signing your offer and checking the appropriate space(s) provided and identified on the bid schedule, you certify that the end-product(s) is either made, manufactured or grown in South Carolina, or other states of the United States, as applicable. Preference will be applied as required by law. Post award substitutions are prohibited. See "Substitutions Prohibited - End Product Preferences (Sep 2009)" provision.

### SUBSTITUTIONS PROHIBITED – END PRODUCT PREFERENCES (SEP 2009)

If you receive the award as a result of the South Carolina end product or United States end product preference, you may not substitute a nonqualifying end product for a qualified end product. If you violate this provision, the State may terminate your contract for cause and you may be debarred. In addition, you shall pay to the State an amount equal to twice the difference between the price paid by the State and your evaluated price for the item for which you delivered a substitute. #### WARRANTY – STANDARD (JAN 2006)

Contractor must provide the manufacturer's standard written warranty upon delivery of product. Contractor warrants that manufacturer will honor the standard written warranty provided.

### SCOPE OF WORK / SPECIFICATIONS

The purpose of this solicitation is to acquire lighting for the South Tower Restroom Renovation that is currently being executed under State Project H27-6108-MJ. Lighting units are defined as lighting fixtures, lenses, mounting accessories, and lamps all delivered according to this scope of work and the detailed specifications. Prior solicitations, construction projects, procurements, and awards, as well as internal University policies and campus standards have no effect on this solicitation or the specifications provided herein.

All items shall be new. Refurbished supplies will not be accepted.

The basis of design lighting fixtures and two prior approved equals are as noted in the attached schedule. All fixtures shall include a 5-year warranty including LED lamps and drivers.

The specifications listed herein are not to be considered restrictive to one source of supply. However, items offered shall be equal in quality and performance. The Offeror should include with its bid supporting product data sufficient for the University to determine equality and acceptability. The University reserves the right to reject any offering in which the items offered are considered unsatisfactory in any manner. The University shall determine if minor deviations from the listed features are acceptable.

Proposed submitted substitutions will be considered. This is NOT a brand-specified procurement. All offers shall comply with the required specifications, not necessarily be identical to the manufacturer(s) referenced. There is not an "approved equal" process prior to bidding.

Contractor shall deliver to and store at a bonded warehouse within fifty miles of the USC South Tower residence hall. South Tower is located at 614 Bull Street, Columbia, SC 29201. All materials shall be stored undercover. Warehouse shall be provided by the Contractor. Delivery of lighting is required within eight (8) weeks of signed shop drawings and no later than May 11, 2105.

Contractor shall coordinate with the General Contractor (for the larger south Tower Bathroom Renovations project) for up to six (6) separate deliveries from the warehouse location to the job site. Lighting shall be sequenced, coordinated, and delivered to correspond to a top-down flow of work starting on the 18<sup>th</sup> floor and delivered to the job site between May 11, 2015 and July 1, 2015

All components are to be shipped FOB Destination as noted above. Contractor shall coordinate shipment with the General Contractor with a minimum of forty-eight (48) hours in advance of arrival and off-load shipments upon delivery.

Contractor shall submit cut sheets and shop drawing information for approval by the project electrical engineer prior to releasing any product for manufacturing. Delivery of fixtures shall be no later than eight (8) weeks after receipt of approval drawings from the project electrical engineer.
