ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS**

1. Related to Question #39: Is it necessary to submit one original and five copies of the Cover Page, Addendum Acknowledgement and other required purchasing documents or is one original version all that is needed?

**Answer: Only one copy of the cover page, addendum acknowledgement and other required documents are needed but one (1) original copy of the proposal and five (5) hardcopies of the proposal are still needed.**

2. Related to Question #82: Our question was directed more to other entities having the ability to sell hospitality packages to groups on game day. Will the Contractor have the exclusive right to sell hospitality packages to corporations/large groups or will other entities also have the ability to sell these packages?

**Answer: Our outbound sales team actively pursues large groups and packages tickets with concessions and merchandise, but no other entity on our behalf is selling hospitality packages.**

3. Related to Question #94: Due to confidentiality concerns, we plan on submitting a banking letter of reference with our RFP response but prefer to provide financial statements and annual reports in-person should we be selected for an interview.
