#### PART 1 - GENERAL

# 1.1 RELATED DOCUMENTS

A. Drawings and general provisions of the Contract, including General and Supplementary Conditions and Division 01 Specification Sections, apply to this Section.

### 1.2 SUMMARY

- A. Section Includes:
  - 1. Thin-set, epoxy-resin terrazzo flooring.

### 1.3 DEFINITIONS

A. Aggregate: Marble chips or other types of aggregate.

#### 1.4 ACTION SUBMITTALS

- A. Samples for Verification: For each type, material, color, and pattern of terrazzo and accessory required showing the full range of color, texture, and pattern variations expected. Label each terrazzo sample to identify manufacturer's matrix color and aggregate types, sizes, and proportions. Prepare Samples of same thickness and from same material to be used for the Work, in size indicated below:
  - 1. Terrazzo: 6-inch- square Samples.
  - 2. Accessories: 6-inch-long Samples of each exposed strip item required.

## 1.5 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Installer Qualifications:
  - Engage an installer who is a contractor member of NTMA.
- B. Source Limitations: Obtain primary terrazzo materials from single source from single manufacturer. Provide secondary materials including patching and fill material, joint sealant, and repair materials of type and from source recommended by manufacturer of primary materials.

C. Source Limitations for Aggregates: Obtain each color, grade, type, and variety of granular materials from single source with resources to provide materials of consistent quality in appearance and physical properties.

# 1.6 DELIVERY, STORAGE, AND HANDLING

- A. Deliver materials to Project site in supplier's original wrappings and containers, labeled with source's or manufacturer's name, material or product brand name, and lot number if any.
- B. Store materials in their original, undamaged packages and containers, inside a well-ventilated area protected from weather, moisture, soiling, extreme temperatures, and humidity.

## 1.7 FIELD CONDITIONS

- A. Environmental Limitations: Comply with manufacturer's written instructions for substrate temperature, ambient temperature, moisture, ventilation, and other conditions affecting terrazzo installation.
- B. Field Measurements: Verify actual dimensions of construction contiguous with precast terrazzo by field measurements before fabrication.
- C. Provide permanent lighting or, if permanent lighting is not in place, simulate permanent lighting conditions during terrazzo installation.
- D. Close spaces to traffic during terrazzo application and for not less than 24 hours after application unless manufacturer recommends a longer period.
- E. Control and collect water and dust produced by grinding operations. Protect adjacent construction from detrimental effects of grinding operations.

### PART 2 - PRODUCTS

# 2.1 PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

A. NTMA Standards: Comply with NTMA's "Terrazzo Specifications and Design Guide" and with written recommendations for terrazzo type indicated unless more stringent requirements are specified.

    - b. TER2: Black: Black Logo Color: David Allen Sample #DA 17-981
    - c. TER3: Garnet: Garnet Logo Color: David Allen Sample #Da 17-984: Garnet Pantone match with glass aggregate.
  - 4. Materials:
  - 5. Flexible Reinforcing Membrane: Manufacturer's resinous membrane for substrate-crack preparation and reflective-crack reduction.
    - a. Reinforcement: Fiberglass scrim.
  - 6. Primer: Manufacturer's product recommended for substrate and use indicated.
  - 7. Epoxy-Resin Matrix: Manufacturer's standard recommended for use indicated and in color required for mix indicated.
    - a. Physical Properties without Aggregates:
      - 1) Hardness: 60 to 85 per ASTM D 2240, Shore D.
      - 2) Minimum Tensile Strength: 3000 psi per ASTM D 638 for a 2-inch specimen made using a "C" die per ASTM D 412.
      - 3) Minimum Compressive Strength: 10,000 psi per ASTM D 695, Specimen B cylinder.
      - 4) Chemical Resistance: No deleterious effects by contaminants listed below after seven-day immersion at room temperature per ASTM D 1308.
        - a) Distilled water.
        - b) Mineral water.
        - c) Isopropanol.

- d) Ethanol.
- e) 0.025 percent detergent solution.
- f) 1.0 percent soap solution.
- g) 10 percent sodium hydroxide.

- 8. Aggregates: Comply with NTMA gradation standards for mix indicated and contain no deleterious or foreign matter.
  - a. Abrasion and Impact Resistance: Less than 40 percent loss per ASTM C
    131.
  - b. 24-Hour Absorption Rate: Less than 0.75 percent.
  - c. Dust Content: Less than 1.0 percent by weight.

# 2.3 STRIP MATERIALS

- A. Thin-Set Divider Strips: L-type angle, 3/8 inch deep.
  - 1. Material: Aluminum.
  - 2. Top Width: 1/8 inch.
- B. Control-Joint Strips: Separate, double L-type angles, positioned back to back, that match material and color of divider strips and in depth required for topping thickness indicated.

# 2.4 MISCELLANEOUS ACCESSORIES

- A. Strip Adhesive: Epoxy-resin adhesive recommended by adhesive manufacturer for this use.
- B. Patching and Fill Material: Terrazzo manufacturer's resinous product approved and recommended by manufacturer for application indicated.
- C. Resinous Matrix Terrazzo Cleaner: Chemically neutral cleaner with pH factor between 7 and 10 that is biodegradable, phosphate free, and recommended by sealer manufacturer for use on terrazzo type indicated.
- D. Sealer: Slip- and stain-resistant, penetrating-type sealer that is chemically neutral; does not affect terrazzo color or physical properties; is recommended by sealer manufacturer; and complies with NTMA's "Terrazzo Specifications and Design Guide" for terrazzo type indicated.
  - 1. Surface Friction: Not less than 0.6 according to ASTM D 2047.
  - 2. Acid-Base Properties: With pH factor between 7 and 10.

#### PART 3 - EXECUTION

# 3.1 EXAMINATION

- A. Examine substrates and areas, with Installer present, for compliance with requirements for installation tolerances and other conditions affecting performance of the Work.
- B. Proceed with installation only after unsatisfactory conditions, including levelness tolerances, have been corrected.

# 3.2 PREPARATION

A. Clean substrates of substances, including oil, grease, and curing compounds, that might impair terrazzo bond. Provide clean, dry, and neutral substrate for terrazzo application.

### B. Concrete Slabs:

- Provide sound concrete surfaces free of laitance, glaze, efflorescence, curing compounds, form-release agents, dust, dirt, grease, oil, and other contaminants incompatible with terrazzo.
  - a. Shot-blast surfaces with an apparatus that abrades the concrete surface, contains the dispensed shot within the apparatus, and recirculates the shot by vacuum pickup.
  - b. Repair damaged and deteriorated concrete according to terrazzo manufacturer's written recommendations.
  - c. Use patching and fill material to fill holes and depressions in substrates according to terrazzo manufacturer's written instructions.
- C. Verify that concrete substrates are dry and moisture-vapor emissions are within acceptable levels according to manufacturer's written instructions.
  - 1. Moisture Testing: Perform tests indicated below.
    - a. Calcium Chloride Test: Perform anhydrous calcium chloride test per ASTM F 1869. Proceed with installation only after substrates have maximum moisture-vapor-emission rate of 3 lb of water/1000 sq. ft. in 24 hours.
      - 1) Perform tests so that each test area does not exceed 200 sq. ft., and perform not less than two tests in each installation area and with test areas evenly spaced in installation areas.
- D. Proceed with installation only after the substrates have a maximum relative humidity measurement less than 80%. If relative humidity measurement is greater than 80% a Moisture Vapor Treatment is required and is to be provided.

- E. Protect other work from water and dust generated by grinding operations. Control water and dust to comply with environmental protection regulations.
  - 1. Erect and maintain temporary enclosures and other suitable methods to limit water damage and dust migration and to ensure adequate ambient temperatures and ventilation conditions during installation.

# 3.3 EPOXY-RESIN TERRAZZO INSTALLATION

- A. Comply with NTMA's written recommendations for terrazzo and accessory installation.
- B. Place, rough grind, grout, cure grout, fine grind, and finish terrazzo according to manufacturer's written instructions and NTMA's "Terrazzo Specifications and Design Guide."
- C. Installation Tolerance: Limit variation in terrazzo surface from level to 1/4 inch in 10 feet; noncumulative.
- D. Ensure that matrix components and fluids from grinding operations do not stain terrazzo by reacting with divider and control-joint strips.
- E. Delay fine grinding until heavy trade work is complete and construction traffic through area is restricted.
- F. Flexible Reinforcing Membrane:
  - 1. Prepare and prefill substrate cracks with membrane material.
  - 2. Install membrane to produce full substrate coverage in areas to receive terrazzo.
  - 3. Reinforce membrane with fiberglass scrim.
  - 4. Prepare membrane according to manufacturer's written instructions before applying substrate primer.

# G. Strip Materials:

- 1. Divider and Control-Joint Strips:
  - a. Locate divider strips in locations indicated.
- 2. Accessory Strips: Install as required to provide a complete installation.

## 3.4 REPAIR

A. Cut out and replace terrazzo areas that evidence lack of bond with substrate. Cut out terrazzo areas in panels defined by strips and replace to match adjacent terrazzo, or repair panels according to NTMA's written recommendations, as approved by Architect.

# 3.5 CLEANING AND PROTECTION

# A. Cleaning:

- 1. Remove grinding dust from installation and adjacent areas.
- 2. Wash surfaces with cleaner according to NTMA's written recommendations and manufacturer's written instructions; rinse surfaces with water and allow them to dry thoroughly.

# B. Sealing:

- Seal surfaces according to NTMA's written recommendations.
- 2. Apply sealer according to sealer manufacturer's written instructions.
- C. Protection: Provide final protection and maintain conditions, in a manner acceptable to Installer, that ensure that terrazzo is without damage or deterioration at time of Substantial Completion.
