### Introduction

The Grants Operations Team supports College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) faculty and other researchers by managing the administrative aspects of their research grants. We provide resources, systems, and support so faculty can focus on conducting research and creating knowledge.

This quarterly report is intended to present a college-wide view of external, approved proposal submissions and new awards made to college faculty and researchers. Data on proposals are sourced from the university's electronic research administration system, USCeRA.

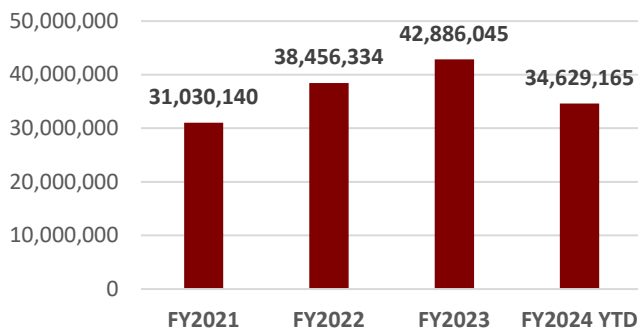
**In the first half of FY24, CAS faculty and other researchers have been awarded \$34.6 million in external funding for research, service, and training.**

**Proposal submissions are up 11% compared to this time last year.**

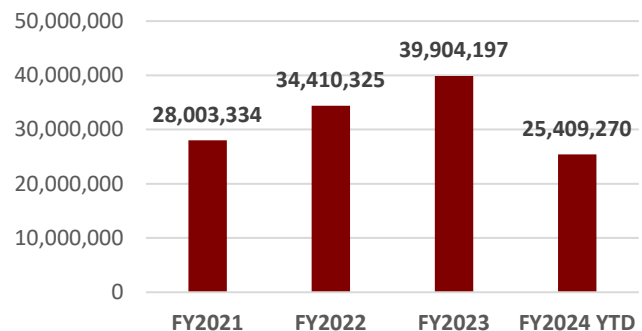
### External Funding Awarded to CAS Faculty

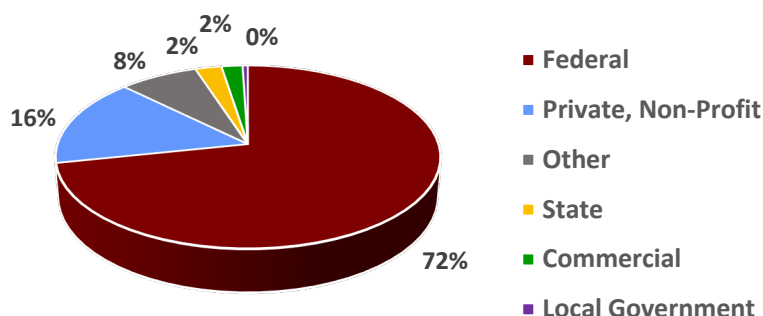
