STUDY ORIGINS: S.C. AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE


- Top 10 states for femicide in 23/25 past years; 6th in 2019
- S.C. female residents report in CDC surveys:
 - Highest lifetime rate of stalking by intimate partners
 - Among highest lifetime incidence of any form of intimate partner violence
 - Among highest lifetime incidence of psychological abuse by intimate partners





STUDY ORIGINS: S.C. AND ACCESS TO JUSTICE


- In 2015, Governor's Task Force on Domestic Violence recognized lack of data on Orders of Protection as an obstacle to redressing domestic violence in the state.
- S.C. is the only state to not offer temporary, *ex* parte orders of protection at the time an Order of Protection case is filed.
- The National Center for Access to Justice's Justice Index ranks South Carolina last among all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico for having the lowest number of attorneys for people living in poverty.



























ORDER OF PROTECTION FILINGS










