



# **FALL 2020 CLASS FORMATS**

#### How are classes being offered this fall?

The health and safety of faculty, staff and students are the Moore School's
top priority. To maintain social distancing and keep students and faculty
safe, new instructional formats are being offered this fall, many combining
traditional face-to-face instruction with live-streaming enhancement.
This means classes are broadcast live to students located outside the
classroom where they will participate in class in real-time over the internet.

### Why does my schedule show my classes as web-based or online?

- If you see "online" or "web" on your schedule, this does not necessarily
  mean your class is completely online. While well-structured online classes
  offer high-quality education, this fall only around 10% of Moore School
  classes will be fully online without a live teaching component. Instead, the
  Moore School will be offering as many face-to-face, live-streaming classes
  as possible.
- As a result, the majority of classes will be held in in real-time, allowing students to benefit from face-to-face or live interactions, participate in class discussions and ask questions while offering the opportunity to learn remotely should the student become ill or be unable or uncomfortable leaving their current location.
- This face-to-face/live-stream model is the format that has been used by our top-ranked Professional MBA program for decades. Academic research shows that this type of instruction provides the same student outcomes and the same degree of student satisfaction as traditional face-to-face classes.

## Will the full class meet in person every week for face-to-face classes?

Some classes will meet in person every week for face-to-face classes, but some, due to social distancing requirements and class size limitations, will have students attending face-to-face classes on a rotational basis; for example half in the classroom and half remotely via live-stream.
 Some classes may even be taught remotely in a virtual face-to-face format if, due to health concerns, faculty are unable to be in the classroom physically. In all of these combinations, high-quality education similar to traditional face-to-face classes will be delivered.

#### Will live-streamed classes be recorded?

 Yes, all live-streamed classes will be recorded and made available to students. Recording classes allows students to access the course content in the event that they become ill and are unable to attend classes, faceto-face or virtually, or have other valid reasons that prevent them from attending class at the scheduled date and time.

# What other class formats are being offered?

 The university is offering a wide variety of class formats in addition to faceto-face classes including virtual class sessions held in real-time. View the full list of available class formats and schedule codes on the next page. To help you understand the format in which classes in the fall will be taught, below is a guide for instructional delivery formats. Most Moore School classes have in-classroom, face-to-face meeting days. We will also offer classes with virtual, face-to-face class meetings, while only around 10% (designated DWEB) are "fully online," meaning you complete coursework on your own time and without regular class meetings.

Your schedule is being updated daily as adjustments are made to the fall schedule, so please review it regularly for changes.
