



**Dr. Donald V. Moser** is a CPA (inactive) whose professional experience includes accounting/auditing positions with several large financial institutions. He joined the Katz School faculty in 1986 after completing his Ph.D. at the University of Wisconsin. He served as the inaugural Director of the Katz School Master of Science program in Accounting and has chaired or served on most of the School's high-level committees, including a term as the elected chair of School's Executive Committee. He is also the Lou and Myra G. Mervis Chair.

His research examines the influence of economic and other behavioral factors on decision making, with the goal of developing integrated models that better explain and predict behavior than either economic or alternative behavioral models alone. Along with several coauthors, he is the recipient of a number of research awards, including the Notable Contribution to Accounting Literature Award, the Notable Contribution to Management Accounting Literature Award, the Glen McLaughlin Prize for Research in Accounting Ethics, and several conference best paper awards. He recently received The Provost's Award for Excellence in Mentoring (2015) for his work with doctoral students.

Dr. Moser has served as an Editor for *The Accounting Review* and as an Associate Editor for the *Journal of Management Accounting Research*. He currently serves as a member of the editorial board of a number of prominent accounting journals and his publications include articles in leading accounting journals (e.g., *The Accounting Review*; *Journal of Accounting and Economics*, *Contemporary Accounting Research*; *Accounting, Organizations and Society*; *the Journal of Management Accounting Research*; and *Accounting Horizons*), economics journals (e.g., *Journal of Labor Economics* and *Games and Economic Behavior*) and psychology journals (e.g., *Journal of Risk and Uncertainty* and *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*).
