Kennedy Career Enhancement Series Letter of Intent Example

This letter of intent is from a student who was reaching out to a pharmacy organization, Phi Lambda Sigma (PLS), about the opportunity to serve on a national committee. Below is helpful background information for those who may be unfamiliar with PLS and provide more context for this example.

PLS is the pharmacy leadership society which aims to promote the development of leadership qualities. They are actively looking for students and alumni to serve the society through committees. While they seek committee members, an individual might not know which committees they will be selected to serve on. In this scenario, and similar ones, a letter of intent is beneficial to express interest in serving without focusing on one specific role.
