UofSC Nutrition Consortium Mini Research Symposium


Our symposium will feature oral presentations of doctoral dissertation work across the spectrum of nutrition science from the following recent graduates.



Tushar Trivedi

Dr. Tushar Trivedi is a vascular neurologist and stroke medical director at Regional Medical Center, Orangeburg, SC. He holds an MPH and a Ph.D. in epidemiology, MD in medicine, and has further completed neurology residency training and vascular neurology clinical fellowship. Dr. Trivedi's research interests include inflammation, intracranial atherosclerosis, and stroke. He has successfully combined clinical care, research, and teaching, and continues to work on advancing and understanding the causes and treatment of stroke.

Malcolm Bevel

Dr. Bevel is a Postdoctoral Associate in the Department of Population Health Sciences. He is a May 2020 graduate from the University of South Carolina's Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics. He received his Bachelors of Science in Biology from Prairie View A&M University in 2009 and his Masters of Science in Public Health with a concentration in cancer epidemiology from Meharry Medical College in 2011. Dr. Bevel worked for Vanderbilt University for two years as a research associate assisting with studies focused on atherosclerotic health among kidney transplant patients before studying for his PhD. His focuses are cancer and chronic disease health disparities within the African American community, and using the community-based participatory research approach to tailor interventions to the needs of the underserved. Her research examines context-specific drivers that shape dietary decisions that individuals make for themselves and others. She is interested in strengthening evidence that programs and policy can use to design and implement programs for better nutrition, health, and overall quality of life.

Her research focuses on food and nutrition policy in low- and middle-income countries and the double burden of malnutrition in India. She has experience in applying evaluation and research methodologies as a William J. Clinton Fellow for Service through the American India Foundation, and as a research assistant and educator on nutrition projects in the United States and India. She currently works with the Drivers of Food Choice Program to support and facilitate ongoing efforts to synthesize and disseminate learnings from across Drivers of Food Choice projects in diverse low- and middle-income countries and is a co-lead on research investigating the intersection between the food environment and food choice in these settings.
