PERSONAL STATEMENT

I am pleased to have this opportunity to be considered for renewal of the rank of Clinical Professor as a member of the faculty at the University of South Carolina (UofSC), College of Social Work (CoSW). Prior to my academic appointment at the CoSW, I worked as a practitioner for twelve years at a statewide public interest law firm that protected the disability rights of South Carolinians with disabilities, as well as worked for 8 years as a dialectical behavior therapist in a private practice. After a national search in 2012, I was selected to serve as the Director of Field Education at UofSC CoSW in a clinical faculty slot, at the rank of Clinical Assistant Professor. In 2016, I was considered and awarded rank to Clinical Associate Professor. Beginning in 2021 and ending in summer of 2022, I was considered and awarded rank to Clinical Professor. I am seeking renewal based on performance in administration, research, teaching and/or service as defined in the clinical protocols that have been provided to you for the rank of Clinical Professor. My personal statement features benchmarks and deliverables for the year 2022.

Teaching and COVID Impact

In this section, I will first share my statement of teaching philosophy, documentation of teaching activities, and including the absence of a peer evaluation.

Statement of Teaching Philosophy

My approach to teaching builds from two basic principles: 1.) use active and reflective learning strategies to achieve learning outcomes, and 2.) promote anti-oppressive, diverse, inclusive, and equitable practices which use equitable and accessible strategies and modalities of delivery used in the classroom or in practicum.

As a professor, I have found that students need time to internalize learning. I have found active learning strategies (e.g., practice labs, case method, role plays, simulations) to be most beneficial in imparting knowledge, but intentional reflection (e.g., Schon's work, Deal) must be paired with these strategies for learning to blossom. I focus on the student's identification of significant learning for each class or seminar versus their personal satisfaction, and whether that matched intended learning outcomes. This approach allows me to assess for unintended learning, and ensures we are on track. I collect data from every class to help direct the semester, which I find more valuable and helpful. To that end and the focus on significant learning, I explicitly use a Socratic method of questioning and encourage application of concepts to practicum, seminar. If I am teaching a traditional classroom class, lectures are rarely used, except to review a more complex concept before we move into an active learning strategy such as decision case discussion. I am also cognizant of the importance of clearly articulating the core principles for each seminar class that can help students both analyze the application I am addressing as well as be able to apply the concept to other situations that may be relevant to them. I believe I am a conduit as a teacher for bridging the gap between theory to practice for students. By empowering students through my questions (or asynchronous labs) to develop insight or to help solve the important social work scenarios they may face, I not only can assist them to stay engaged, but I can also better gauge their understanding and application of the material in real time. A real love of mine is using decision cases in any class I teach. I think scenarios, vignettes and decision cases offer students, and practicum educators an opportunity to problem solve issues they will and do manage as a professional social worker.

Teaching: Diversity and Community Engagement

I have approached my teaching philosophy with a flexibility that is more accommodating of varying pedagogies that address different learning styles. I now offer students options for completing practicum assignments related to accrual of supervised field hours or assignments that range from reflection papers, application papers, service projects to enhanced experiential learning labs (EELLs). Additionally, I have added statements to each syllabus and the field manual that address our commitment to anti-oppression and diversity, which need to be revisited.

My research and scholarship have included marginalized populations by focusing on rural, underserved and shortage areas by geographic regions when applying for grants. I do believe and uphold the ideals of addressing the lived experiences and issues faced by marginalized populations in our state and beyond. Finally, the nature of my administrative job requires I be community engaged as described under the administrative section of this personal statement.

My appointment of teaching classroom courses is replaced with my Director of Field Education position which includes the oversight of all field education activities and courses which totaled 743 students for 25 sections for the 2022 cover Spring, Fall and Summer. Two of these students were taught an Independent Study summer sessions, as well as 2 students took block advanced practice field in summer of 2022. I provide final grades to social work students enrolled in field education courses, and the numbers are identified in my CV attached to this personal statement. This requires reviewing and grading every process recording, supervision note, timesheet, learning contract and final evaluation of every student enrolled in a field education course that holds a practicum component. Additionally, I am responsible for the syllabi development for practicum course curricula to include BSW social work field education courses 382, 481, 482, and 483 and the MSW social work field education courses 781, 782, 783 and 784. I don't receive evaluations tailored to practicum but did include evaluations from serving as a field liaison, and for orientation and training I provide in my educational and administrative position. Finally, I included a very confidential 360 evaluation of how others perceive me in my current role from 2021. These are typically conducted every 5 years for those in a leadership position, so I feel I should share. I was happy to see that others rated me high on every construct except for self-care. Time management is self-care to me. In my 1:1 coaching with Nathan Strong, we discussed my tendency to undervalue my scope and depth of competence compared to my supervisors, colleagues, and supervisees (If you look at the ratings, I rated myself on average a point below all others).

Further, I teach and mentor in other capacities. For 2022 I mentored 1 PhD student in drafting and defending their dissertation proposal, and 2 BSW students in an Independent Study. Finally, sometimes I will serve as a field instructor to a student in a grant or community project I am engaged. For 2022, I served as a field instructor to 4 students in employment-based placements because they had no one Onsight or other resources.

Additionally, I continually assess and enhance curriculum for all field courses and have been dedicated to expanding our field program through the acquisition of training grants (more detail provided under *Research*) so we may better prepare our next generation of social workers. As evidenced, I engage in teaching at a high-quality level as evidenced by my sharing learning outcomes from courses I teach at peer reviewed national conferences each year (e.g., CSWE, SSWR, and APA) and I remain committed to teaching students, so they are equipped with the necessary skills, knowledge, and values they need to be effective practitioners. Since I train community practitioners, I do feel like I have a substantiated idea of what is needed.

Research

For 2022, I participated in 5 grants either as the PI, Co-PI, or in a social work role. My sole motivation is to curate practicum education opportunities or needed learning opportunities which is core to the role of being a Field Director. Most notably as PI, I acquired a 1.7 million dollar grant which began in late January of 2022 to develop wellness and workplace resiliency strategies and skills to address burnout, and the rise of behavioral health issues among health professions. Please reports and evaluations of these in my zipped file.

Additionally, for 2022 I have one peer reviewed chapter in progress with Dr. Naomi Farber. I have also published or am *in press* with 7 peer reviewed articles, submitted another two (2) articles for peer review, provided five (5) peer reviewed presentations at a national level, and provided thirteen (13) workshops/seminars. My highlight for 2022 was being invited to lead the memoriam for Marion Bogo and

Closing Plenary at the International Interdisciplinary Conference on Clinical Supervision in July of 2022.

These numbers do not include all scholarship categories identified on my CV, including my leading, designing and presenting at each annual field education training and orientation for field instructors, liaisons, and students at both the MSW and BSW levels. These activities alone reach around 200 field educators a year as well as 350-400 students.

In terms of a formal research agenda, my scholarly work emphasizes developing professional competencies of social work students, so they become effective social work practitioners. In summary, I have focused my scholarship in two general areas.

- 1.) My first scholarship focus is studying the pedagogy of social work education. For example, although field education is considered the signature pedagogy, I am also interested pedagogies that advance practitioner skills sets other than "in-person" learning. Practicum education learning outcomes are a demonstrated interest, as well as simulation labs and the decision method of teaching. These forms of pedagogy serve to aid and complement field education and other content courses. More specifically, the use of decision cases in field education, for example, aid students (in field seminar class) and field educators (field instructors, liaisons, task supervisors) learning as well as testing the effectiveness and intended learning outcomes of these forms of pedagogy. I also write decision cases from real stories and develop accompanying teaching notes.
- 2.) My second research focus involves promoting and evaluating the acquisition of evidence-based practice competencies, such as CSWE competencies and interventions, to include Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT), as well as EELLS which focus on specific skill sets. I have found that by developing innovative practicums and learning labs, we best serve and advance competency development of students and address workforce needs. Students should be able to demonstrate evidence-based strategies and interventions in field that are measurable, marketable and that will ultimately contribute to their employability. All of this work is purposed towards developing our workforce and preparing the next generation of social workers. I feel at the core that is my purpose as the College's Director of Field Education.

Service

In addition to my administrative role, I have been actively engaged in productive and sustained service at the college, state, national and international level. At the College level in 2022 alone, I participated in 7 different committees, and chair the Workforce and Field Education Advisory Committee. Most important is my participation on the MSW and BSW program committees, as Field Education as a central construct is necessary to bridge the gap between theory and practice. Additionally, I maintain strong working relationships with our local and statewide community partners through the development of new field placements each year and in volunteer managing our 300+ community partnerships where our student's complete internships. Because of the strong reputation of our field practicum model, we receive calls regularly about establishing new partnerships for future students and are well received across the state. I am invited to provide workshops by many local community partners given my expertise in behavioral health practice, as I remain active on South Carolina's State Mental Health Planning Council given my continued interest in behavioral health and serve as Chair of the Nominating Committee as well as the Vice-Chair of the State's Mental Health Planning Committee.

Nationally, I was elected to the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE), Council on Field Education (COFE) in 2020 to serve a three-year term as the <u>chair of CSWE COFE</u>. My role as chair has been exceptionally demanding as I had been helping shape policy and standards for CSWE EPAS during the pandemics of racism and COVID-19 and also serve on the Commission on Education Policy and the CSWE's <u>Commission on Accreditation's 2022 EPAS writing group</u>. In general, the Council on Field Education advances the role of field education as the signature pedagogy in social work education by promoting,

collaborating with, recommending, and distributing information to social work field educators and related membership organizations. The council actively participates in discussions regarding the Educational Policy and Accreditation Standards to ensure and strengthen the integration of theory and practice. I am excited to be a part of this council and look for to leading during these very trying times and through my appointment to June of 2023.

Administrative Leadership

As Director of Field Education, I provide leadership and oversight of all M/BSW field education activities in the US, including but not limited to:

- 1. Oversight of the processing and implementation of all students placed in internships for both the BSW (40+ students) and MSW programs (300+ students).
 - 2. Meeting 1:1 with all students at risk of or those that have been displaced and/or terminated from their practicum site while enrolled in a practicum education course. I meet with a minimum of 120 students on face-to-face meetings, liaisons and at times community practicum instructors and other relevant parties involved in the practicum model of practice for problem resolution. This number has increased since the onset of COVID-19 and we have experienced increase in practicum transitions this past academic year alone resulting in a higher demand for my time.
 - 3. Lead the design and implementation of all practicum education orientations and advisements for MSW and BSW.
 - 4. Employ, maintain, train, and evaluate part-time faculty practicum liaisons (18+) and faculty in his/her role as practicum liaison.
 - 5. Administer, collect and analyze annual evaluations of practicum education sites, instructors, liaisons and both practicum education programs.
 - Design and implement curriculum for MSW practicum education courses (SOWK 781, 782, 783, 784) and BSW Practicum Education Courses (SOWK 382, 481, 482, 483) and coordinate teaching assignments by faculty or part-time instructors.
 - 7. Provided oversight to three Field Placement Managers for the credentialing of field instructors (350+ field instructors and task supervisors) and practicum sites for 2022.
 - 8. Provide ongoing CEU opportunities provided through the field office to current practicum educators.
 - 9. Provide direct supervision for 30 minutes each week 1:1 to in person FTE staff (4), 3 staff, 2 FTE faculty, and one in person temp FTE and 3 grant FTE employee, as well as biweekly supervision to 3 PT Field Seminar Instructors, and then practicum liaisons as needed.
 - 10. Ensure all field policies, procedures, practices and courses are adherent to the Council on Social Work Education, Educational Policies and Academic Standards and collaborate with Data Accountability Coordinator and Associate Dean of Curriculum.
 - 11. Participate in additional relevant committee assignments.
 - 12. Pursue external funding to support field education and students.

Key Challenges for 2022

In 2022, practicum education students continued to demand more scheduled 1:1 time to meet their needs, and this was true for community partners (e.g., field instructors, liaison, etc.) as well. The Field Education Office of which I lead continued to experience an overwhelming surge in correspondence from all constituency members, including students. This need was difficult very difficult to meet given transition

and continuing transition within the field office. Two of our key staff left January 1, 2022; one for a promotion to clinical teaching in the BSW program, and the other to a mental health case manager job on campus that paid 10k more with only a 10-month contract. I also lost a half-time appointment of the BSW Coordinator (Sudie Nallo) and half-time appointment of Lana Cook to Curriculum Accountability Coordinator. I was provided help of a temp with Adam Englert, but he was only appointed .75 to field as he also taught a class under the associate dean of curriculum each semester. This was a 2.25 FTE loss for most of 2022. In addition to the challenges of the shifting workplace environment, adjusting to onboarding and training new employees, and managing changing contexts for field standards at a national level proved challenging to manage.

Administratively, my areas of greatest impact for 2022 ar found in the supplemental attachment which asks this question as well.

Conclusion

In conclusion, I believe that my teaching, research, service, and administrative leadership have helped advance social work field education at UofSC CoSW. Moreover, I have contributed knowledge and research at a national level through peer reviewed conferences, papers and leadership positions. As an educator, I have demonstrated excellence and innovation in ways that vertically and horizontally integrate my teaching with research, service, and leadership. My hope is as we aim to be fully staffed, complaints about availability will lessen. My leadership is provided at a national level as Chair of COFE, as well. Thank you for the opportunity to present my case for renewal to Clinical Professor.
